I find it particularly unconscionable that you would feel it necessary at a time when so many people are in financial distress, and having to make sacrifices, to ~~raise~~ raise water rates. What you charge for the monthly minimum is already unconscionably high. When I bought my cabin in Crestline, the monthly minimum was \$15.50. A year or so later it was raised to \$25.50 and now you want \$35.50. I spend most of my time in La Verne and go to my cabin usually on weekends and bring my water with me unless I shower so as to avoid the high water rates so I basically pay \$25.50 for nothing. I'm at a loss to understand why we have to pay a monthly minimum. Are we renting your pipes? The gas co doesn't charge me for their gasoline nor does the electric co. charge me for their electricity lines. In La Verne I pay the water co. a monthly minimum fee of \$8.00 and 40¢ per unit of water used. I don't know how many cubic feet of water equals one unit but I very seldom ever use more than 80¢ worth. I see that Crestline charges a lower minimum monthly fee than most other mountain communities. Apparently you feel left behind, although you make up for it somewhat in what you charge for the amount of water used. Apparently we are at the mercy of whatever arbitrarily chosen amount you want to charge, which seems unconscionably high - especially in a time like this.

P.S. forgive the handwriting. I couldn't print this as my printer doesn't work. I do my printing at the library and of course all libraries are closed. Attending the public hearing seems like a bad idea these days which perhaps you are counting on to help your "cause".
