Field Manager

We did Valley View's hydrant maintenance and completed it. Fortunately, only one valve was not functioning and we will mark it for repair. They have requested that we flush their dead ends next. We let them know that they can be added onto our schedule since ours is due now. We are unable to start this currently because the water truck is in the shop for repairs.

We have started working on our broken valves list. This list is about 20 years old, so we are happy to get these operational.

CSD vault is near completion on the repairs. We are producing a safe chlorination plan to disinfect, then sample and if all goes well with no leaks, return to service.

This year is time to have half of our tanks inspected and cleaned by a dive team. I reached out to the two we have previously used. Only one has gotten back to me. They quoted eight tanks for \$14,200. This is up from the last time in 2020 which was about \$10,000.
