Pooled Money Investment Account Monthly Portfolio Composition ⁽¹⁾ 01/31/21 \$124.0 billion

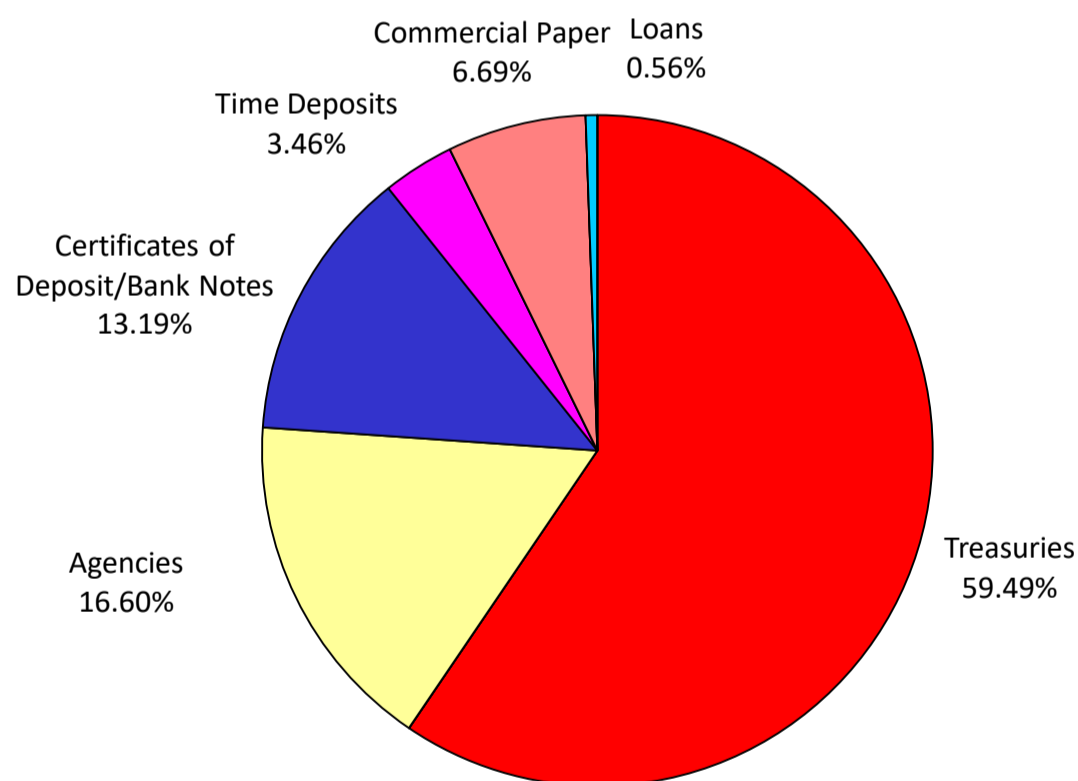
